

Sports Premium Funding Impact Report
Boothferry Primary School, Goole: 2017 – 2018



Background

The Government is providing additional funding for primary schools in order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools.

This funding is being jointly provided by the Department for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children.

All state-maintained schools academies, middle schools, special schools and pupil referral units which have primary aged pupils will receive the funding. This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can only be spent on provision for PE and sport in schools. We will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils' progress and participation in PE and school sport. We are required to publish on-line information about how we have used the additional funding, including details about our sporting provision alongside curriculum details.

This will ensure that parents and carers and other are made fully aware of the PE and sporting provision at Boothferry School.

Allocation

For the academic year of 2017 – 2018 we will receive an amount of £16,000 plus and additional £10 per pupil = £18,880

How we will be spending the sports premium funding:

We believe in a holistic approach to the development of sport and physical activity for all and encourage collaboration and partnership working to make the best use of resources and enhance PE and sport provision in order to raise participation and achievement for all pupils.

We have undertaken a PE and school sport audit to develop our sports premium plan to raise standards and participation levels in PE throughout the school. We will know that we have succeeded when:

- **A high standard in PE teaching is consistent across school.**
- **CPD opportunities are provided for teachers, so that they confidently deliver quality PE lessons.**
- **Confidence and quality of teaching amongst all staff improves; PE attainment levels and progress of pupils improves.**
- **The improving levels and progress of pupils is continued to be tracked / assessed.**
- **More children take up sport through after school clubs and intra/inter school competitions.**
- **There is an increased amount of competition sport in school.**
- **There is an increased amount of sporting competitions won by teams representing the school in a variety of different sports.**
- **We make links to other community sports providers.**
- **The school develops its breadth of additional clubs and activities for children, outside the curriculum.**

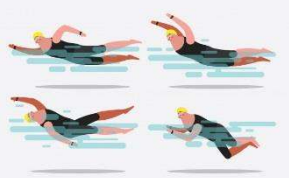


MEETING THE NATIONAL CURRICULUM REQUIREMENTS FOR SWIMMING AND WATER SAFETY

68% of our current Year 6 cohort swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.

47% of our current Year 6 cohort use a range of strokes effectively, including front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke.

68% of our current Year 6 cohort are able to perform safe, self-rescue techniques in different water-based situations.

<p>East Riding School Sports Partnership:</p> <p>We receive a core offer of a half a day PE support. The coach models outstanding teaching for the initial two weeks of a new discipline, whilst the teacher observes.</p> <p>The coach then works with the teacher to plan, deliver and assess the provision for the next two week, following a progressive unit of provision. The final two weeks are then planned, delivered and assessed by the teacher independently, with the coach on hand to advise and intervene where necessary.</p>	<p>£6219.20</p>	<p>Throughout the year, Mr Butterworth supports staff with planning and assessment with PE. He also delivers lessons for observation and then carries out reciprocal observations on teachers.</p> <p>Mr Butterworth also supports Mrs Hooton/ Mrs Bullock with the PE leader role in terms of assessment, audit checking, purchasing new equipment, swimming assessment and tracking.</p> <p>He facilitates our involvement with GASP competitions and sources after-school provision from external providers, in response to our areas of need.</p> <p>All of the above has enabled our pupils to receive the daily active 30 minutes of provision, which meets government requirements.</p> <p>We have attended 50% more competitive tournaments this year in comparison to last year.</p>

<p>Sports covered include after school provision also (indoor athletics, football, dodgeball, change4life). Students from Goole Academy are enlisted to help deliver this provision.</p> <p>Support is also given to our PE leader who maintains an overview of the teaching of PE across the school, carried out audits of resources and enrolls our pupils in local and wider sporting competitions.</p>
