Did you spot any usual transport?</p> <p>Make the data you have collected into a bar graph to see which is the most popular form of transport.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">History</p> <p>Research your favourite mode of transport and create an information text/leaflet about the history of the transport.</p> <p>Who invented it? Could it be a Megabus with a football pitch on the top deck?</p> <p>Could it be a flying hoverboard?</p> <p>Be as creative as you can. Can you research facts about him and have a go at creating your own artwork inspired by him?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Maths</p> <p>When reading a map it is important to understand compass directions (N, E,S,W) as well as your left and right. Can you design an obstacle course with directions for a family member to follow. Could you include turns (half turns, fully turns, quarter turns) into your directions?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Jigsaw/English</p> <p>Write a postcard or letter to a friend or neighbour to cheer them up. Could you post it to them?</p>

Can you label what food groups they belong to?</p> <p>Can you challenge yourself to try a new fruit or vegetable? Imagine you were travelling somewhere, maybe to a new world, you encounter a problem and you have to escape. You could be travelling anywhere, on any form of transport.
