<p>Maths</p> <p>Look at a map of the world on the internet and locate all of the rainforests in the world. Your challenge is to then find out how many miles or kilometres away from England they all are. Present your findings in a table. What do you notice about their positions on the map?</p>		<p>Geography</p> <p>Rainforest Products: Find out about products which come from the Rainforest. Identify what they are used for and who uses them. Find out how far these products had to travel for you to use them? Present your findings on a fact sheet. E.g. Bananas - Bananas can be found in rainforests in South America. They travel 5238 miles to get to the UK.</p>	<p>Art/ DT/ English</p> <p>Create your own rainforest animal. You can present this whichever way you want (e.g. draw, make) Write a character description for your new animal.</p>
<p>Reading</p> <p>Read a book and complete an Accelerated Reader quiz.</p> <p>https://ukhosted6.renlearn.co.uk/2245355/</p>	<p>ICT</p> <p>Access the interactive rainforest games</p> <p>https://www.topmarks.co.uk/Search.aspx?q=rainforest</p>	<p>English/ DT</p> <p>Research facts about the Amazon Rainforest and create a fact file. Then use your knowledge to create a rainforest game that will help children learn the key words/facts about rainforests. Don't forget to make rules for your game!</p>	<p>Science</p> <p>Research animals that live in a rainforest. Then choose your favourite rainforest animal and produce a poster including a food chain for the animal and facts about its habitat.</p>
<p>Music</p> <p>Make your own rainstick</p>	<p>Topic</p> <p>What is deforestation? Can you create a leaflet explaining your findings.</p>	<p>Art/ DT</p> <p>Can you create a symmetrical rainforest tribal mask? Draw a line of symmetry down the middle of your mask and try to make sure the pattern is the same on each side.</p>	<p>Art</p> <p>There are a huge variety of colours and patterns to be found when investigating rainforest animals and plants. Can you create a piece of artwork which shows both colour and pattern? You may use pencil crayons, pastels, paint...or any other art materials you choose!</p>
